Pirates of the Caribbean: The Curse of the Black Pearl (19th July 2003) (Cambridge Film Festival)

Blacksmith Will Turner teams up with eccentric pirate Captain Jack Sparrow to save Turner's love, Elizabeth Swann, from cursed pirates led by Jack's mutinous former first mate, Hector Barbossa. Jack wants revenge against Barbossa, who left him stranded on an island before stealing his ship, the Black Pearl, along with 882 pieces of cursed Aztec Gold.

Pirates of the Caribbean: Dead Man's Chest (6th July 2006) (United Kingdom)

Lord Cutler Beckett of the East India Trading Company arrests Will and Elizabeth for aiding Captain Jack Sparrow in the previous film. Beckett offers clemency if Will agrees to search for Jack's compass in a bid to find the Dead Man's Chest—and inside, the heart of villainous Davy Jones—which would give Beckett control of the seas. However, Jack wants the Chest to escape from an unpaid debt with Jones, who made Jack captain of the Black Pearl for 13 years in exchange for 100 years of service aboard Jones' ship, the Flying Dutchman. Sparrow's debt is complicated by both Will Turner and Elizabeth Swann, who follow him out to sea.

Pirates of the Caribbean: At World's End (24th May 2007) (United Kingdom)

Lord Beckett gains power over Davy Jones and, with the help of the Flying Dutchman, he is now executing his plans to extinguish piracy forever. To stand against the East India Trading Co., Will, Elizabeth, Barbossa, and the crew of the Black Pearl set out to rescue Captain Jack Sparrow from Davy Jones' Locker. As one of the Nine Pirate Lords, Jack is needed in order to release an ancient goddess with the power to defeat Beckett's forces.

Pirates of the Caribbean: On Stranger Tides (18th May 2011) (United Kingdom)

Captain Jack Sparrow is on a quest to find the fabled Fountain of Youth and crosses paths with a former lover, Angelica. She forces Jack aboard the Queen Anne's Revenge, a ship captained by the infamous pirate Blackbeard, Angelica's father. Both are also in search of the Fountain: Angelica to save her father's soul, Blackbeard to escape a prophecy of his demise at the hands of a one-legged man. Joining the hunt is former pirate captain Barbossa, now a privateer in King George II's Navy, who is in a race against the Spanish for the Fountain of Youth.

Pirates of the Caribbean: Salazar's Revenge - Captain Jack Sparrow is pursued by old rival Captain Salazar and a crew of deadly ghosts who have escaped from the Devil's Triangle. They're determined to kill every pirate at sea...notably Jack.

Storyline

12-year-old Henry Turner sneaks out of the house at night to row his boat to a place with certain coordinates. He dives into the sea and steps on the Flying Dutchman at the same moment as it rises from the depths of the ocean. On the deck of the ship, he meets his father, Will Turner, and tells him that he has found a way to break his curse and free him from his ship. Will is taken from this, but does not believe it is possible and tells Henry to leave the sea permanently. However, Henry vows not to quit until he gets his father back.

Nine years later, Henry Turner serves in the British Royal Navy. As their ship chases the pirate ship, Henry discovers that the captain is about to sail them into the Devil's Triangle, a dangerous and treacherous place. The captain does not listen to Henry's warnings and labels him a traitor. As they sail inside the Triangle, they come across the wreckage of the ship. From there rise live dead sailors, led by the Spanish captain Armando Salazar.

A ghost crew takes over the ship and kills every sailor and soldier in their path. Thrown into the ship's pipe, Henry confronts Salazar, who sees a wanted warrant for Captain Jack Sparrow in Henry's cell. She leaves Henry alive so he can tell the ghost crew's story. Salazar thirsts for revenge on Jack and asks Henry to take a message to him: "I will still see the light of day and that day death will come to fetch him."

The young woman Carina Smyth is sentenced to death for witchcraft, as she is engaged in astronomy and horology. He manages to escape from his cell and runs into Jack Sparrow, who is trying to rob the Bank of Saint-Martin with his crew. Henry also faces the death penalty, as he is presumed to have committed treason on board a Royal Navy ship. Carina meets Henry in a sick person and tells her that she knows how to find Poseidon's trident, a powerful object that gives its owner the ability to control the seas. Henry plans to use a trident to break his father's curse, while Carina wants to find a "map that no one can read" to find out who his father was.

Carina helps Henry escape, and he finds the detainee Jack's cell. Henry tells Jack about himself and the trident, and that he needs Jack's help in finding it. In addition, he conveys to Jack a message from Salazar. Both Jack and Carina find themselves in the city square to be executed. Together with Jack's crew, Henry helps them escape and they set sail on Jack's ship, The Dying Gull. Carina shows them the map left by her father, which leads Poseidon to the trident, and reluctantly becomes Henry and Jack's partner to achieve their own goal.

Salazar and his crew get out of the Devil's Triangle, where they were trapped (after Jack Sparrow swapped his compass for whiskey). Captain Hector Barbon, who now controls the seas, receives information on his ship that Salazar has already sunk three of his ships. He offers to help Salazar track down and kill Jack against his life. Salazar recounts how he and his crew once sailed the seas, killing every pirate, until they encountered a young Jack Sparrow, who was not yet a captain. Jack tricked them into sailing into the Devil's Triangle, where Salazar and his men died and were cursed to remain alive dead and trapped in the Triangle.

Salazar's ship Silent Mary (Silent Mary) finds a dying seagull. Jack, Henry, and Carina escape by boat while the rest of the crew remains on board to mislead the invaders. Salazar and his men pursue Jack, but when they arrive on a small island, Jack realizes that the ghost crew cannot step on dry land. In Executioner Bay, Jack has to pay off an old debt to an acquaintance by marrying his sister, but Barbossa and his crew interrupt their intentions. He does not intend to keep his promise to the dead, who deprived him of the domination of the sea, but intends to restore the Black Pearl to its former glory.

After returning the Black Pearl to the waters, the crew sails with Salazar in their stern to the location of Poseidon's trident, a small island that is not visible on any map. A battle breaks out when Salazar finds the Black Pearl and almost kills Jack, who he nevertheless hopes will free him and his crew from the curse. Instead, he kidnaps Henry and takes over his body momentarily. The sea splits in two as Carina restores the rock missing from the constellation. Jack and Carina find Poseidon's tomb, as well as a trident at the bottom of the sea.

Salazar eventually gets his hands on the trident and attacks Jack with it. Henry and Carina realize that the destruction of the trident breaks every curse associated with the sea. Henry manages to break the trident. In doing so, he returns Salazar and his crew to their original state. Jack, Henry, Carina and Barbossa are dragged to safety by the anchor of the Black Pearl. However, Salazar and many of his men hold on to their intention to kill

Jack. Barbossa, who has realized that Carina is her daughter, sacrifices herself while knocking down Salazar and her husband, ensuring a safe boarding for Carina, Jack and Henry.

After some time, Henry expects his father, Will Turner, to get ashore, and to be free from the Flying Dutchman. Will arrives ashore and finally confronts his son and wife, Elizabeth Swann. Carina and Henry's relationship evolves, and Carina announces that she has changed her last name from Smyth to Barbossa. Jack, on the other hand, sails with his crew on the Black Pearl, and Barkossa's monkey Jack joins them.

In the scene shown after the end credits, Will Turner and Elizabeth Swann are asleep when the silhouette of Davy Jones falls into their room. Will wakes up and states that he has had a nightmare. However, after Will goes back to sleep, there are pieces of coral on the floor.
